The Department is also authorized to transfer up to 5.0 percent of the total appropriations in this subsection to the following line item appropriations within the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing, Executive Director's Office, Information Technology Contracts and Projects, Colorado Benefits Management Systems, Operating and Contract Expenses and Colorado Benefits Management System, Health Care and Economic Security Staff Development Center.

36 Department of Human Services, Office of Information Technology Services, Colorado Benefits Management System, Ongoing Expenses, Operating and Contract Expenses -- Of this appropriation, \$7,782,079 remains available through June 30, 2019.
